If you're interested in global issues try some of these projects in your school:

- Join the UNESCO Associated Schools Network (ASPnet).
- Hold a “30 Hour Famine” or a fundraiser for the Food Bank.
- Host a cultural exchange through Change for Children.
- Initiate a school-wide program on rights and responsibilities, exploring the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms and creating a school charter of rights and responsibilities.
- Invite a trauma response counsellor, to speak to the school about disaster relief.
- Sponsor a “foster child” or “adopting” families and assisting them with basic needs.
- Raise funds for international support (ie digging water wells or building schools) or participate in the Global Village program through Habitat for Humanity.
- Organize an Environmental Club to educate members and the student body about environmental and social justice issues.
- Hold global awareness days in honour of Human Rights Day, Anti-Racism Day, International Women’s Day and Earth Day.
- Host guest speakers in a variety of fields, with diverse ethno-cultural backgrounds and life experiences. (for example, activist, elder, feminist, LGBT, philanthropist)
